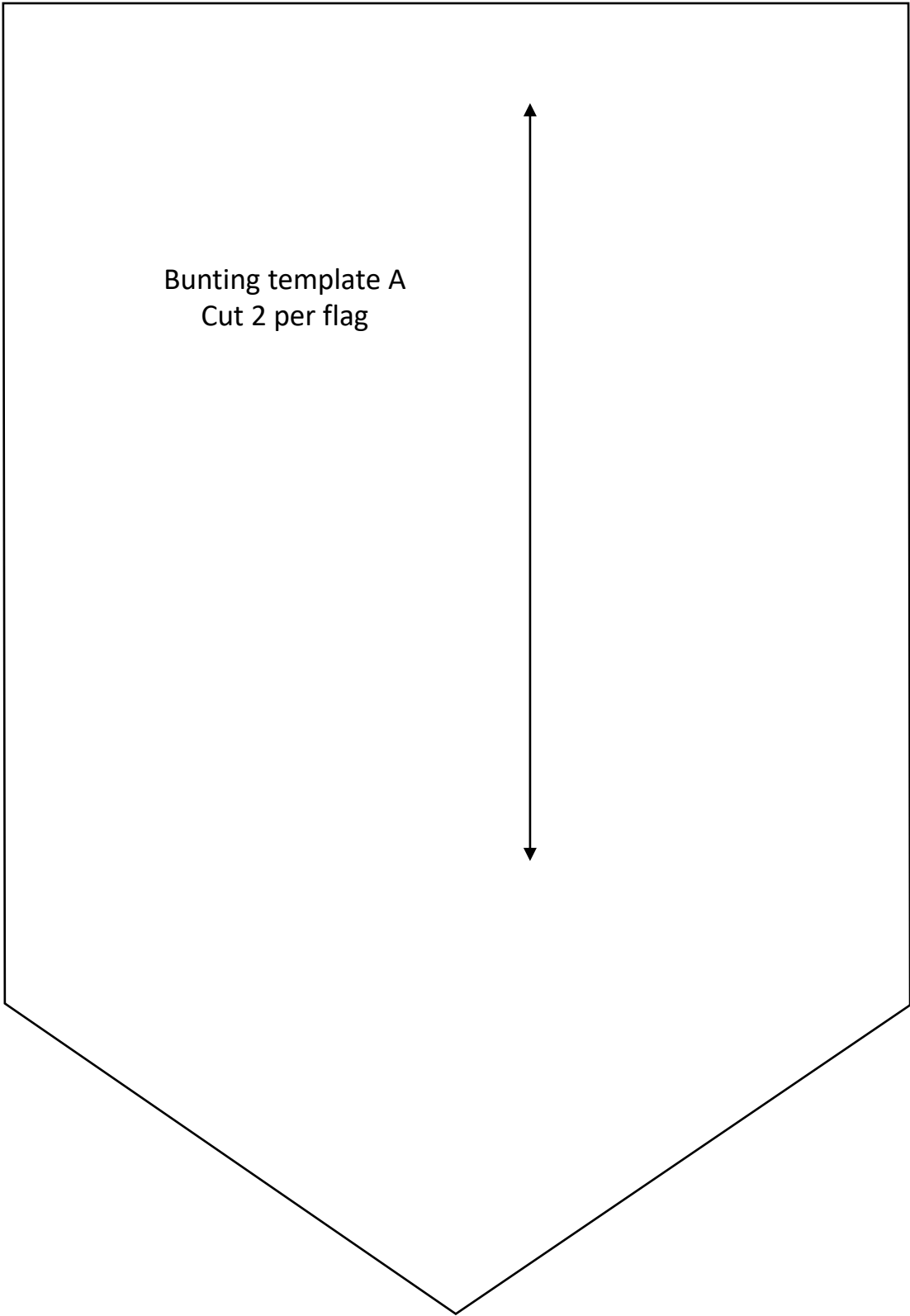
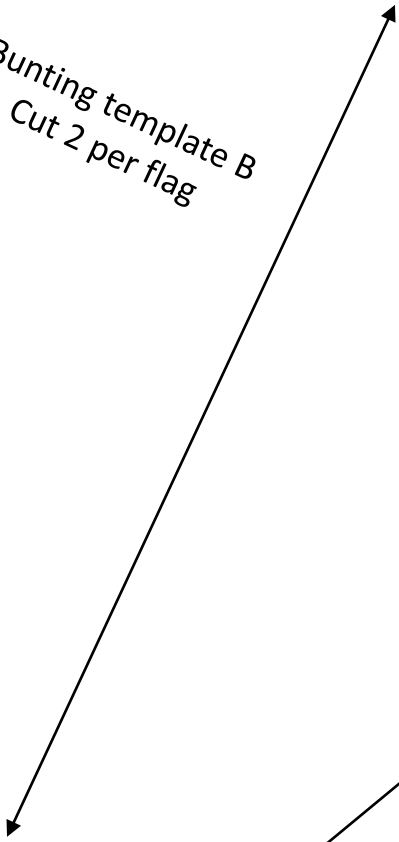

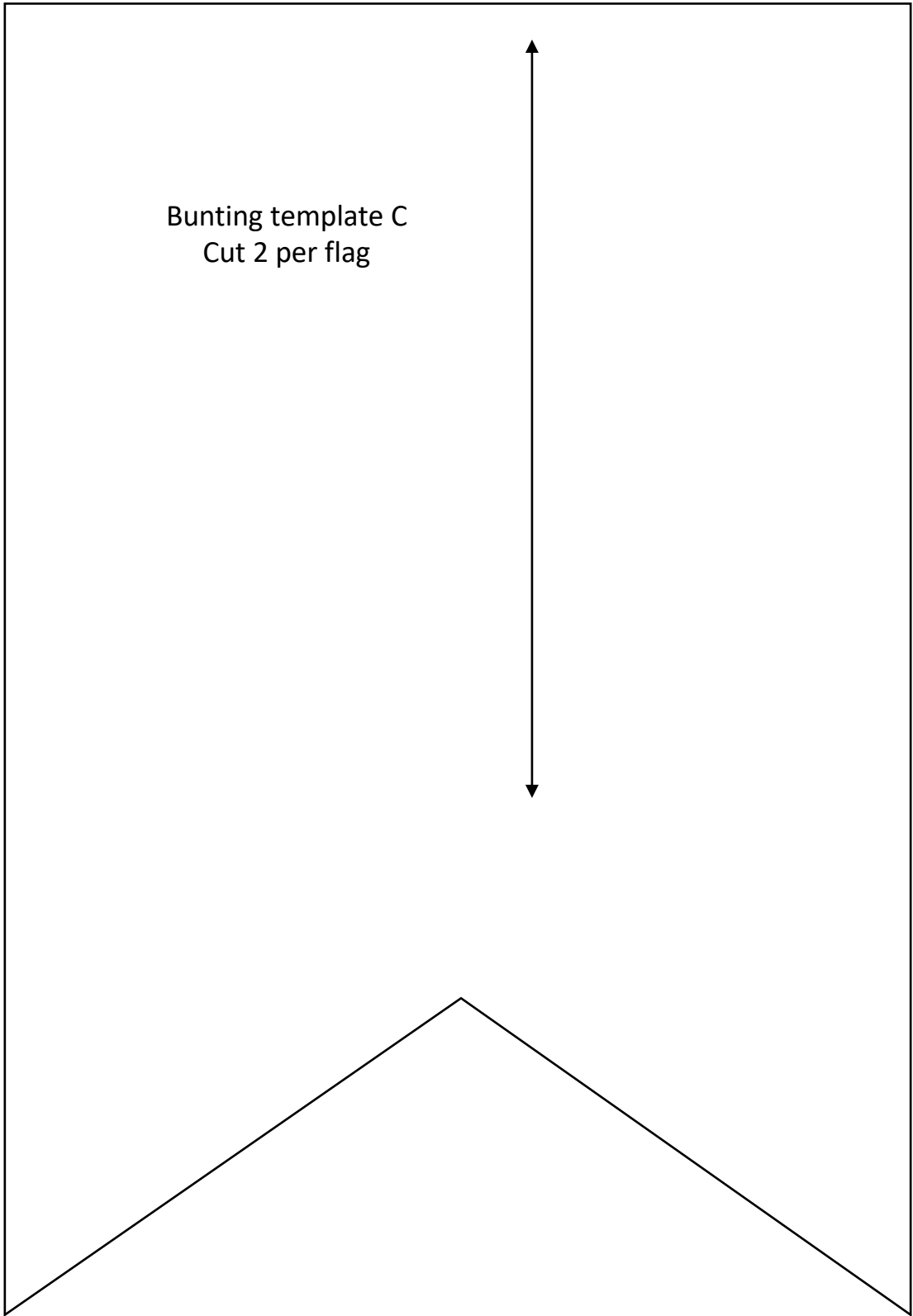


# Bunting Templates

# Bunting Templates

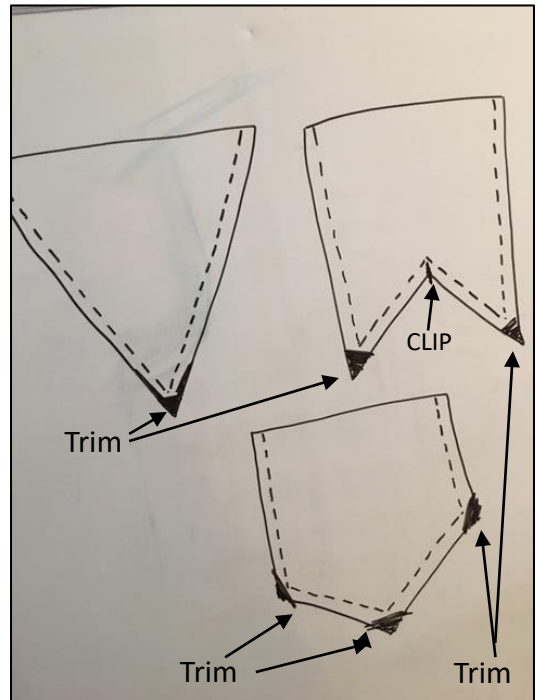


## Guide to making great bunting



1: Use the templates to cut out your bunting flags. You will need TWO pieces of fabric for each flag. With RIGHT sides together make a 6mm seam around your flag leaving the TOP EDGE open (un-stitched) Remember to lower the needle into your flag when turning corners.

2: Trim the corners of each flag. The diagram shows where you will need to trim away the bulk of the corners. If you are using flag template C you will also need to clip into the inverted 'V' as shown. Always trim or clip to within 2mm of stitching being careful not to cut the stitching.



3: Join your flags together. Here are some suggested methods:

A: Fold a small turning to the inside of each flag. Zig-zag twine, wool or braid to the back of the flags.

B: Use bias binding to encapsulate the top of the flags

C: Cut strips of fabric using pinking shears and use them to encapsulate the top edge.

D: Cut strips of fabric, fold in a small hem, encapsulate the top edge.

4: Spacing:

This is personal preference but I would recommend a spacing of between 3-7cms between flags.
